# Coastal Boxer Rescue Intake Procedure

### **PRE-INTAKE**

- 1. Owner Surrenders County coordinator or volunteer is required to meet with owner to obtain the following information:
  - a. Reason for surrender
  - b. Copies of veterinary records
  - c. Behavioral History
  - d. Personality traits (likes, dislikes, fears, etc)
  - e. Tolerance with people, other dogs, cats, children
  - f. Provide CBR Canine Release form and CBR Owner Release forms to the owner
  - g. See Appendix A for additional information to obtain from the owner
- 2. Identify potential approved foster home that will be a good fit
- 3. Obtain board of director approval

#### **INTAKE**

- 1. Obtain signed and completed CBR Canine Release form and CBR Owner Release forms from the owner
- 2. A CBR volunteer MUST BE Present when owner is surrendering to ensure all required paperwork is completed.
- 3. Enroll the dog in the database and obtain C number
- 4. Work with coordinator who is authorized to set up an appointment with a CBR approved veterinarian and provide C number:
  - a. Send copies of vaccines/medical records to CBR approved vet, if any
  - b. Refer to Medical Requirements section below
- 5. Dogs with no veterinary information are required to be seen by a CBR veterinarian prior to foster home placement (or as soon as possible after placement)
- 6. Place dog in a prior approved foster home. Obtain signed/completed forms from the foster family:
  - a. CBR Transfer of Custody form
  - b. Volunteer Agreement and Release Form
- 7. **UPDATE the database** to include the following:
  - a. Vaccine information
  - b. Microchip information
  - c. Additional health information
  - d. Foster family information
- 8. Share dog information with County Coordinators for potential adopters

### **MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS**

Lepto (if only DHPP is administered)	Required
Bordetella	Required
Heartworm Test	Required
Spay/Neuter	Required
Fecal Test	Required

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## **APPENDIX A - PRE-INTAKE QUESTIONS**

- 1. Why is the owner surrendering?
- 2. How long have they had him/her?
- 3. Is she/ he sterilized?
- 4. Is she/he indoor or outdoor?
- 5. Is she/he on heart worm prevention?
- 6. Is she/he up to date on vaccines & checked for heartworm?
- 7. Do they have medical records? If so, what is veterinarian name?
- 8. Any medical issues or concerns & urgency?
- 9. Is she/he obedience trained, etc.?
- 10. How is her/his temperament?
- 11. Does she/he get along well with other dogs (small & big), if living with other dogs?
- 12. Does she/he get along well with kids?
- 13. Is she/he ok with cats?
- 14. How about with men & women (some dogs are afraid or apprehensive of men)?
- 15. How long can they hold onto the pup before surrendering?
- 16. Are they surrendering because of behavior or something else, if so, have they worked with trainer to resolve?
- 17. Where are they located in your county?
- 18. Provide several pics & videos & are the pics recent, since we want recent pics.
- 19. Depending on the case, if owner really cares for the pup & is willing to work with the him/her to not surrender, can recommend trainer, etc., etc. (This has worked with a few OS keeping their pups).
- 20. Ask if possible, for owner to get pic or video interacting with other dogs and/or with children, so we have proof, & use it for when we look for foster (not always possible to get)
- 21. Best if volunteer can meet the pup being surrendered, to see first-hand the temperament, condition of the dog, etc., etc. (and if possible, how he/she is with other dogs).
- 22. Afterward, just tell them that you are going to share the info with the other rescue volunteers & get back to him.
- 23. You can explain that our rescue does not have a shelter, because we are foster based, so we normally have to look for a foster first. It all depends too on the urgency of the particular situation.
- 24. Also, do not promise them that we can take the dog in because all dogs that come into rescue have to first be approved by our board.
- 25. If the dog is a mixed, then we will have to see pic first to see if we can help or share with another rescue that can help them.
